You will please take notice that the undersigned, will, within 30 days, file an application in the General Land Office, at Washington, D.C., for the survey of that certain unsurveyed island in Vermilion Lake, St. Louis County, Minnesota, more particularly described as follows:

An unsurveyed island located in the Eastern central portion of the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 32, Township 63 North, Range 16 West, 4th P.M., containing approximately Fifty Hundredths (0.50) acre, more or less, lying about 3565 feet South 77 degrees West of the North M.C. on Lot 6, and 110 feet from the Northeast point of Lot 4 of said Section 32.

You are allowed thirty (30) days from the receipt of this notice, within which to file in said General Land Office, any papers you may wish to submit tending to show cause, if any there be, why the said Island should not be surveyed and disposed of as public land of the United States.
