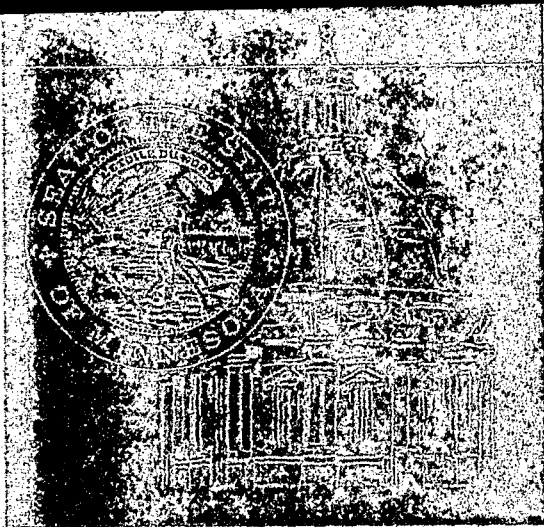




Proclamation

WHEREAS: the progress and well-being of the citizens of Minnesota depends to a great extent upon education and training for the "World of Work" as provided in the school systems of this State; and

WHEREAS: profound sociological, economic and technological changes in our society are bringing about rapid changes in the structure and nature of "Man's World of Work" thereby placing new and additional responsibilities on the educational system; and

WHEREAS: the Congress of the United States and the Legislature of the State of Minnesota have recognized these problems and have acted upon them through appropriate legislation; and

WHEREAS: professional contributions of the vocational educators of this State have assisted youth and adults in the process of preparation for work; and

WHEREAS: the American Vocational Association, by representative assembly, has established the second week in February as "Vocational Education Week" and is supported by the Minnesota Vocational Association in this action;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of February 10 - 16, 1974 as

NATIONAL VOCATIONAL EDUCATION WEEK

in the State of Minnesota, and urge all citizens of the State to observe this week by making themselves better acquainted with Vocational Education purposes and programs by visiting any vocational institution or program in their area.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-four and of the State the one hundred and fifteenth.
