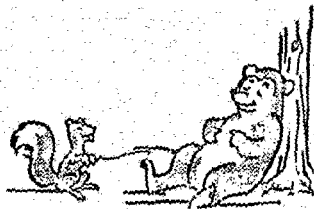

WHEREAS, certain territory described below is not presently included within the corporate limits of any incorporated city, village or burrough; and WHEREAS, this territory borders upon the village limits of the Village of Paynesville and is deemed to be urban in character; and

WHEREAS, the property has access to Village water and sewer and has been developed to some degree and is in a position for further development.

NOW THEREFORE, the Village Council of the Village of Paynesville ordains:

Section. TERRITORY ANNEXED. The corporate limits of the Village of Paynesville, Minnesota, are hereby extended to include the unplat-

territory described as follows: which territory is now and has heretofore been adjacent to the incorporated limits of the Village of Paynesville.

That part of the right of way of trunk Highway No. 55 located across the Northeast One Quarter and the Northwest One Quarter of the Southeast One Quarter (NE 1/4 of NW 1/4 of SE 1/4) of Section Seventeen (17), Township One Hundred Twenty-two (122), Range Thirty-two (32).

Also that part of the West One Half of the East One Half of the Southeast One Quarter (W 1/2 of E 1/2 of SE 1/4) of Section Seventeen (17) Township One Hundred Twenty-two (122), Range Thirty-two (32) lying South of the South right-of-way of Trunk Highway No. 55 not already incorporated in the Village of Paynesville.

Also that part of the East One Half of the East One Half of the Southeast One Quarter of Section Seventeen (17) Township One Hundred Twenty-two (122), Range Thirty-two (32) lying south of the South right-of-way line of Trunk Highway No. 55, all of the above property being in Stearns County, Minnesota.

Section 2. The quantity of land embraced within the foregoing description and bounded as described is approximately 30 acres more or less.

Section 3. FILING. The Village Clerk is hereby directed to file certified copies of this ordinance with the Secretary of State, the County Auditor and the Register of Deeds of the County in which the property is located and the Minnesota Municipal Commission.

Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE OF ANNEXATION. This ordinance takes effect upon passage and publication and the filing of certified copies as directed in Section 3, and approval pursuant to Minnesota Statutes. The Village Council does, however, specifically declare that taxes due and payable during the year 1973 shall be payable by the County Auditor to the Paynesville Town Board.

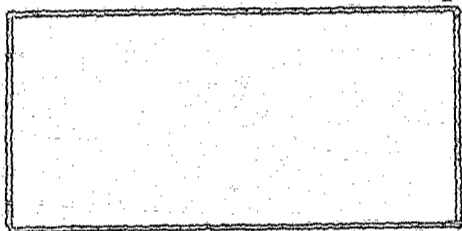
