
Dear Sir:-

You will please take notice that the undersigned, will, within 30 days, file an application in the General Land Office, at Washington, D.C., for the survey of that certain unsurveyed island in Vermilion Lake, Ste. Louis County, Minnesota, more particularly described as follows:

An unsurveyed island located in the central portion of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 32, Township 63 North, Range 16 West, 4th P.M., containing approximately One and Fifty Hundredths (1.50) acres, more or less, lying about 2060 feet South 17 degrees West from the South M.C. on the East line of Lot 2 of Section 29, and 216 feet South of the South-East point of Lot 1 of Section 32, of said Township.

You are allowed thirty (30) days from the receipt of this notice, within which to file in said General Land Office, any papers you may wish to submit tending to show cause, if any there be, why the said Island should not be surveyed and disposed of as public land of the United States.
