WHEREAS: *the students of Minnesota State Colleges represent, in a very real sense, the future of Minnesota; and*

WHEREAS: *one purpose of education in a democratic society is to produce citizens capable of participating in and contributing to that society, including the governmental process; and*

WHEREAS: *all citizens have the right, if not the obligation, to be informed on issues of public concern, and to convey their opinions to their duly elected representative*

WHEREAS: *students at Minnesota State Colleges have come to play an increasingly significant role in all phases of the political process in Minnesota;*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, February 20, 1974 as

*in Minnesota, and do extend to all students visiting the State Capitol a warm and enthusiastic welcome.*
