Proclamation

WHEREAS: the very existence of society depends to a large degree on the education profession; and

WHEREAS: the vocational competence, creativity and intellectual self-reliance of everyone is developed by teachers; and

WHEREAS: our nation must have well-prepared and dedicated professional teachers who will prepare students for the rapidly changing demands of an age that has already surpassed all others; and

WHEREAS: teachers of our sovereign state as well as those of America are thus in a position to deeply affect the public and personal welfare of the nation and each of its citizens; and

WHEREAS: the realization of the importance of education and decisions on future careers comes during a person's high school years; and

WHEREAS: for these and several other good reasons it becomes incumbent upon all of us to attract and retain the best of our youth in maintaining the vitality of the teaching profession;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 14 - 20, 1974 to be

STUDENT ACTION FOR EDUCATION WEEK

in Minnesota, in order to acknowledge publicly the importance of teachers and their accomplishments and to assist in providing the public support there must be if they are to continue in this task.
