WHEREAS: the mails are the all important communications link in every aspect of American and Minnesotan social and economic life; and

WHEREAS: the Postal employee is the most important key in carrying out this indispensable function; and

WHEREAS: the over 10,000 Postal employees in Minnesota have a momentous responsibility which they fulfill with an incomparable efficiency and sense of duty; and

WHEREAS: the Minnesota American Postal Workers Union, AFL-CIO, will hold their Second Biennial Convention June 13, 14 and 15;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim June 13 - 15, 1974 to be

POSTAL EMPLOYEES' DAYS

in Minnesota, and do urge all citizens to accord these hard working and conscientious public employees the recognition that is their just due.
