WHEREAS: the objective of the association is to aid in the advancement and elevation of the medical professions by encouraging women employed as medical assistants to form societies to obtain the educational advantages of lectures, discussions, and instruction in the details of their duties; and

WHEREAS: the highly trained medical assistant plays a vital role in the art and practice of medicine and through the association brings to members educational programs to render more efficient service to the public; and

WHEREAS: this is a non-profit, non-partisan, and non-sectarian organization; and

WHEREAS: the Minnesota State Medical Assistants are meeting for their Eleventh Annual Convention in Duluth, Minnesota on May 3 and 4, 1974;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, May 4, 1974 as
