- WHEREAS: Reverend Robert O. Evans is the founding pastor of the Prince of Glory Lutheran Church, where he has served for over thirteen years; and
- WHEREAS: the fact that he is known as "Pastor Bob" is evidence of the esteem and affection in which he is held by members of his congregation and his community; and
- WHEREAS: during his pastorate at Prince of Glory Lutheran Church, Reverend Evans and the congregation have been a stabilizing force in the North Minneapolis community; and
- WHEREAS: Reverend Evans was on the original Board of Directors of the OEO Community Action Program; and
- WHEREAS: his other community endeavors included the Residents Committee for the Bethune Redevelopment, Mobilization for Economic Resources and the Northside Youth Development Council; and
- WHEREAS: Alice Evans, his wife, founded the Bryant-Glenwood Montessori Educare Center, now providing much needed day care services for North Minneapolis families; and
- WHEREAS: Reverend and Mrs. Evans have met the special needs of the North Minneapolis community with vision, love and understanding; and
- WHEREAS: Reverend Evans and his family are being honored at a reception on Sunday, May 19, 1974 at Northside Settlement Services;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, May 19, 1974 to be
