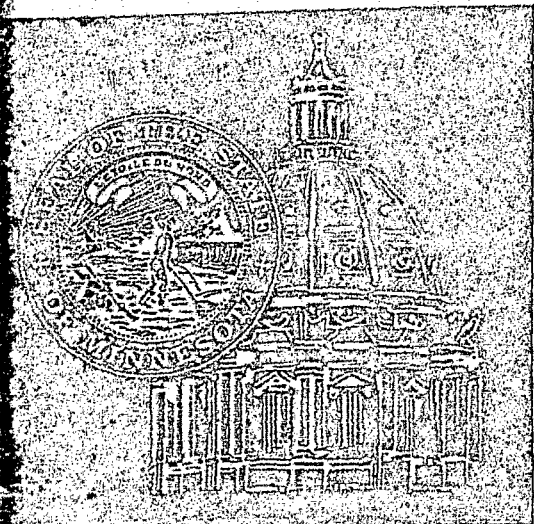

Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Louis P. Cotroneo, a lifelong resident of St. Paul's East Side has been demonstrating the quality that stars are made of since his Johnson High School days; and
- WHEREAS: at St. John's University, where he earned his B. A. in 1952, Lou was captain of the hockey team in his senior year; and
- WHEREAS: after serving two years in Korea, Lou joined the faculty of Johnson High School; and
- WHEREAS: since 1963, Lou has been head hockey coach at Johnson as well as assistant football coach; and
- WHEREAS: during his ten years as head hockey coach, Lou's teams went to the state tournament seven times and to the finals twice; and
- WHEREAS: this accomplishment is reinforced by an enviable record: 199 games won, 56 lost and six tied; and
- WHEREAS: Lou Cotroneo, a true champion himself, is a maker of champions; and
- WHEREAS: his contribution to sports, hockey in particular, has enriched the game, our youth and his community; and
- WHEREAS: Lou's friends have chosen Tuesday, June 4, 1974, as a day to honor Lou Cotroneo for his accomplishments on the field and off;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, June 4, 1974 to be
