- WHEREAS: Sister Anne Joachim Moore had a vision, as did the pioneering sisters before her; and
- WHEREAS: supported by her order, the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, and inspired by a faculty which shared her vision, Sister Anne Joachim founded St. Mary's Junior College in 1964; and
- WHEREAS: St. Mary's is the first college in the United States devoted exclusively to offering associate degrees in health care; and
- WHEREAS: this unique junior college blends general education courses with seven programs in the technical health field; and
- WHEREAS: Sister Anne Joachim, also president and dean, has made learning at St. Mary's Junior College in Minneapolis an exciting and dynamic experience; and
- WHEREAS: many of the 2,102 graduates are from the ranks of the socially and economically disadvantaged, range in age from 20 to 56 and come from as far away as Africa and Ireland; and
- WHEREAS: graduates are working in 47 states, Canada, Central America, Italy and Germany; and
- WHEREAS: the college spirit in the halls is the spirit of success; and
- WHEREAS: Sister Anne Joachim is an inspiration to her associates, her students, her community and her state; and
- WHEREAS: today, June 8, 1974, St. Mary's College is recognizing the achievements of its ninth graduating class and the tenth anniversary of its being;
