



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Charles L. Grant was ordained a Lutheran minister on June 11, 1914, and organized a new congregation in St. Paul the same year; and

WHEREAS: the Faith Lutheran Church, located at Charles Avenue and Mackubin Street, was dedicated on June 11, 1916; and

WHEREAS: Reverend Grant met his future bride, Gladys Nina Evans, in Nazareth, while traveling in the Holy Land in 1923, and they were married three years later; and

WHEREAS: the growth of the congregation necessitated a larger house of worship, and so it was that a second church was built on the same location and dedicated on October 2, 1932; and

WHEREAS: Reverend Grant served as Chaplain of the Minnesota House of Representatives in 1933 and

WHEREAS: on June 1, 1936, his alma mater, the Chicago Lutheran Theological Seminary, conferred on him the degree of Doctor of Divinity; and

WHEREAS: since the organization of Faith Lutheran Church 60 years ago, 15,900 infants have been baptized, 7,359 weddings solemnized, and 8,513 funeral services conducted from the church; and

WHEREAS: since 1968, Reverend Grant has been serving as Pastor Emeritus in an active capacity;

WHEREAS: on June 20, Reverend Grant will celebrate the 60th Anniversary of his ordination in the Lutheran ministry and as a pastor of the Faith Lutheran Church;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, June 20, 1974 to be
