Frank H. Putnam, First being duly sworn, deposes and says that he is a resident of the City of Minneapolis and County of Hennepin. That for many years prior to January 14, 1921, he was employed under a contract with United Autographic Register Company, a corporation foreign to the State of Minnesota, having its principal place of business in Chicago, Illinois. That among other things he was employed to solicit orders for autographic registers, typewriter attachments and general supplies therefor in the State of Minnesota. That the said Autographic Register Company sold some of its registers outright and that in various instances said company did not sell such registers outright, but rented the same to various of its customers in the State of Minnesota, reserving the title thereto in itself, collecting rents for the use of the same, taking the machines up for itself from time to time from its various customers. That the said Autographic Register Company pursued the same course of business in its dealings with respect to various typewriter attachments, placing the same out with its customers who purchased supplies for the same from the Company, but reserving title to the machines in itself and collecting rents therefor, or in certain instances leaving said attachments with its customers free of any rental charge, upon the condition, however, that said customers should purchase from the Company supplies and materials for use in such attachments.

That said course of business so carried on by United Autographic Register Company was followed during the year 1920 and this affiant is informed and believes is still being followed by said United Autographic Register Company in the State of Minnesota.
