I, Thomas Erroline, Auditor of Itasca County, Minnesota, do hereby certify that the Village of Cooley in Itasca County, Minnesota has been created as a separate assessment and election district by the separation of said village from Township of Northwood, Long Pine and Gregory by an election held pursuant to Section 1238 of the General Statutes of Minnesota for the year 1913, and that the attached is a true and correct copy of all papers that have been filed in my office relating to the separation of said Village of Cooley from the said town above mentioned for separate assessment and election and also showing that on the 15th day of October, 1913, at a special election held in the Village of Cooley upon the question of whether the Village of Cooley should be constituted an assessment and election district separate from the above named towns, 46 votes were cast upon said proposition (40) of which were in favor thereof and (6) against the same.

I, therefore certify that from the records on file in my office it does appear that the result of said election was in favor of the separation, and do hereby certify the result of said election to you as required by the section of the law above stated.
