

BALLOT

Special Election, Nov. 4, 1921

Section 8 of Chapter 7 of the Charter of the City of Dawson now reads as follows:

"The total indebtedness of the City shall not at any time exceed five per cent of the total value of the taxable property of said city according to the last preceding assessment for the purpose of taxation, except as hereinafter provided."

The Board of Charter Commissioners of said city have proposed that said section be amended so as to read as follows, to-wit:

Sec. 8. The "net indebtedness," as defined by Section 1848 of the General Statutes of Minnesota for 1913, of this City shall at no time exceed 8 per cent of the assessed value of said City, and all parts of this Charter inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. The City of Dawson shall have power to construct and maintain an Armory in the manner provided by Chapter 506, Laws of Minnesota for 1921, and acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto.

I, William Jackson, Mayor of the City of Dawson, Lac qui Parle County, State of Minnesota, do hereby certify as follows:

1. That on the 28th day of Sept. 1921 the Board of Charter Commissioners of said City in writing duly proposed that Section 8, of Chapter 7 of the Charter of said City be amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 8. The "net indebtedness", as defined by Section 1848 of the General Statutes of Minnesota for 1915, of this City shall at no time exceed 8 per cent of the assessed value of said City, and all parts of this Charter inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. The City of Dawson shall have power to construct and maintain an Armory in the manner provided by Chapter 506, Laws of Minnesota for 1921, and acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto.

2. That prior to the election hereinafter mentioned the said proposed amendment was published thirty days in three newspapers of general circulation in said City of Dawson.

3. That the adoption or rejection of said proposed amendment was submitted to the voters of said City at a special election held in said City in the manner required by the Charter of said City on the 4th day of Nov. 1921, and that at said election 468 qualified voters of said City voted of whom,

351 voted "yes" in favor of the adoption of said amendment,

117 voted "no" and against the adoption of said amendment

4. That by reason of the foregoing facts the said proposed amendment was accepted and adopted by more than three-fifths of the qualified voters voting at said election and supersedes the original Section 8 of Chapter 7 of said Charter.

5. That the attached is one of the ballots used at said election.

13 ing known as Askegaard's Store, situated on Lot 1, Block 1, Aske-
14 gaard's First Addition to the Comstock townsite, Holy Cross Town-
15 ship, Clay County, Minnesota, and within the boundaries of the
16 land and territory described in said petition; that we acted as
17 judges of said election and duly conducted the same as far as
18 practicable, in accordance with the laws of the State of Minnesota
19 regulating the election of town officers; that said election and
20 meeting of electors was then and there held for the purpose of
21 voting for or against the incorporation of the land and territory
22 described in said petition, into the proposed Village of Comstock
23 that said election was in all respects fairly held in accordance
24 with law; that we fully, fairly and duly canvassed all the ballots
25 cast by said electors at said election; that the total number of
26 ballots cast at said election was 37;
27 that the number of ballots cast at said election for said proposi-
28 tion of incorporating the land and territory described in said
29 petition, into said village of Comstock was 35
30 _____; and that the number of ballots cast against said
31 proposition of incorporating said land and territory into said
32 village of Comstock was two
