ORDINANCE NO. 74-2 CITY OF DAYTON HENNEPIN AND WRIGHT COUNTIES MINNESOTA

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN EVEN YEAR ELECTION SCHEDULE PURSUANT TO M.S.A. 205.07 AND ADOPTING A SYSTEM OF BIENNIAL ELECTIONS FOR CITY OFFICERS PURSUANT TO M.S.A. 412.023

The City Council of Dayton, Minnesota, ordains: ...

SECTION !..

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 205.07, commencing with the 1974 City election, the regular city election of Dayton shall be held annually on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year.

SECTION 2.

Those two councilmen elected in the year 1972 under the previous election schedule shall have their terms extended by one year and their successors shall be chosen at the November, 1976 election. Because their terms of office are not in conflict with the "Statutory City" statute as defined in M.S.A. 412.016, the current terms of the other two councilmen are not affected by this ordinance and their successors will be chosen at the November, 1974 election and the November, 1976 election, as would have occurred under the previous election schedule. The mayor elected in the year 1973 shall have his term extended by one year, and his successor shall be chosen at the November, 1976 election.

SECTION 3.

At the 1976 election at which three councilmen are to be elected, the two persons receiving the highest vote shall serve for terms of four years and the person receiving the third highest number of votes shall serve for a term of two years. In all elections after the November, 1976 election the mayor's term shall be for a period of two (2) years and each councilman's term shall be for a period of four years, as prescribed by M.S.A. 412.02.

SECTION 4.

Because of the changes as outlined in Sections one (1) and two (2) above, the City of Dayton will hold an election for city offices in the year 1974.

SECTION 5.

If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not affect the application of the provisions to other persons or circumstances.

SECTION 6.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
