ORDINANCE NO. 336

CITY OF NEW BRIGHTON
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 120 OF THE NEW BRIGHTON CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO ELECTION DATES.

The City Council of New Brighton, Minnesota, ordains:

Section 1. Section 120 of the New Brighton Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 120. ELECTION DATES SET

SECTION 120.00. Pursuant to Minn. Stats. Sec. 205.07 there shall be no 1974 city election, and commencing with the 1975 city election the regular city election of city officials shall be held annually on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each odd-numbered year.

SECTION 120.10. Whenever this change in the election year results in the expiration of any current term of office at a time when no city election is held in the months immediately prior thereto, each term is extended until the date for taking office following the next scheduled city election. At the 1975 election at which three councilmen are to be elected, the two persons receiving the highest vote shall serve for terms of four years and the person receiving the third highest number of votes shall serve for a term of two years.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 129 OF THE NEW BRIGHTON CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO ELECTION DATES.
The City Council of New Brighton, Minnesota, do hereby

Section 1, Section 129 of the New Brighton Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 129. ELECTION DATES SET
SECTION 129.01. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. Sec. 235.07 there shall be no 1974 city election, and commencing with the 1975 city election the regular city election of city officials shall be held annually on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each odd-numbered year.

SECTION 129.10. Whenever this change in the election year results in the expiration of any current term of office of a time when no city election is held in the months immediately prior thereto, each term is extended until the date for holding office following the next scheduled city election. At the 1975 election at which three councilmen are to be elected, the two persons receiving the highest vote shall serve for terms of four years and the person receiving the third highest number of votes shall serve for a term of two years.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication.
