PROCLAMATION. .

WHEREAS, The President of the United States, pursuant to a resolution of Congress, has issued a proclamation calling upon all the states to observe Armistice Day as a legal holiday, as a mark of respect to the memory of those who gave their lives in the late World War and who are typified by the unknown and unidentified American soldier who is to be buried in the Arlington national cemetery on that day.

NOW THEREFORE, I, J. A. O. Preus, Governor of the State of Minmesota, do hereby request that this day, already made a holiday by act of our Legislature, be observed in this state with the dignity and solemnity befitting the occasion, that the flags upon all public buildings be displayed at half staff until noon of said day, and that the President's recommendation be observed in that all public and church bells be tolled at intervals between 10:45 and 11:00 A. M., Central time, and that from 11 o'clock to two minutes past that hour all devout and patriotic citizens indulge in a period of silent thanks to God for these valorous lives and of supplication for His divine mercy and for His blessings upon our beloved country.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed hereto this eighth day of November, 1921.
