



# Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Donald M. Anderson has been administering Minnesota state-federal unemployment insurance programs for almost 37 years; and
- WHEREAS: in October 1966, Donald M. Anderson was named Assistant Commissioner for Unemployment Insurance; and
- WHEREAS: Donald M. Anderson believes the unemployment insurance program is an earned right, not a hand-out; and
- WHEREAS: he has maintained a sunny disposition despite all vicissitudes including state legislative sessions; and
- WHEREAS: one of his principal duties for the past 20 years has been to testify before legislative committees on unemployment insurance laws; and
- WHEREAS: during the 1971 session, Donald M. Anderson spent more than 30 hours explaining to legislators the 1970 federal amendments to the law; and
- WHEREAS: although he sometimes was beset and berated by his constituency, Donald M. Anderson is convinced that Minnesotans are wonderful people; and
- WHEREAS: Donald M. Anderson is being honored at a retirement party on Friday, October 4, 1974
