Proclamation

WHEREAS: October 24 has been declared to be United Nations Day in the United States; and

WHEREAS: the United Nations has declared 1974 to be World Population Year, in order to bring the issue of population growth to the attention of the people and the governments of the world; and

WHEREAS: the issues of world population, world hunger, and the preservation of the world's energy and natural resources are significant to the people of Minnesota, the people of the United States, and the people of all the developed nations of the world; and

WHEREAS: the educational institutions of this state and nation have a special responsibility to call attention to the issues of world population, world hunger, and world ecology

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 24, 1974 to be

WORLD POPULATION DAY

in Minnesota and urge all citizens to take special cognizance of these vital issues affecting the future of all of the people of the world.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-four and of the State the one hundred and sixteenth.
