NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of November as

NATIONAL EPILEPSY MONTH

in Minnesota, and I urge all citizens of Minnesota to take the little time that is required to become better acquainted with the general facts about epilepsy, and to encourage a more enlightened attitude about the disorder. "The more you know about epilepsy, the more you want to help."
