P R O C L A M A T I O N.

Although the Government of the United States has made liberal provision for the care and re-education of the disabled veterans of the World War, there are many cases which the government is unable to provide for. When a man's training course is completed, he is as rehabilitated but under present industrial conditions, such a man may not be able to obtain employment immediately.

The national organization known as The Disabled American Veterans of the World War proposes to raise a fund of \$250,000 to take care of these and other disabled veterans whom the government's care does not reach.


SATURDAY, DECEMBER 17th
