



Proclamation

WHEREAS: the insurance industry in Minnesota is a significant employer of Minnesota residents, is a taxpayer providing the state funds through an excess of revenue over expenses, is an exporter of insurance services to other parts of this country and the world, and is a major factor in the financing of residential and commercial buildings; and

WHEREAS: the insurance industry in Minnesota has produced a high degree of professionalism among its many agents and insurance company personnel through education, on-the-job training, and professional organizations, one of which, the Minnesota Chapter of Society of Chartered Property and Casualty Underwriters - is celebrating its twenty-fifth anniversary; and

WHEREAS: the insurance industry in Minnesota is regulated by a fine staff headed by The Honorable Berton W. Heaton, Insurance Commissioner;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, November 14, 1974 as

INSURANCE DAY

in Minnesota, and urge our citizens to take advantage of this opportunity to respect and understand the broad services the insurance industry provides the state.
