## OFFICIAL CALL FOR STATE, COUNTY AND CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT CONVENTIONS



RESOLVED, By the State Central Committee of the Republican Party of Minnesota, duly assembled pursuant to the call of its chairman and in the exercise of powers and duties duly conferred on it by law; that

STATE CONVENTION—TIME AND PLACE OF—First: the time of holding the state convention hereby is fixed for March 31st, 1922, at 11:00 A. M., and the place thereof shall be the Auditorium at the city of St. Paul, Ramsey county, Minnesota; and said convention shall be held for the purpose of adopting a platform or statement of party principles, and of endorsing candidates for state office, including the office of United States senator. A candidate for United States senator shall first be endorsed, then a candidate for governor, then a candidate for lieutenant governor, for secretary of state, state auditor, state treasurer, attorney general, railroad and warehouse commissioner, and clerk of the Supreme Court. The names of the candidates so endorsed or nominated, and a copy of the platform adopted, shall be certified to the secretary of state by the proper convention officers.

COUNTY CONVENTIONS—TIME OF—PLACE TO BE FIXED—BY COUNTY COMMITTEES—Second: the time of holding the respective county conventions hereby is fixed for March 18, 1922, at 1:00 P. M., and the place of holding the said conventions shall be fixed by the several county committees as provided by law; and said county conventions shall be held for the purpose of electing the county's quota of delegates to the state convention, of electing the county's quota of delegates to the congressional district convention, and of electing or appointing, in such manner as it deems best, a county committee and the convention may adopt a statement of political principles. The proper convention officers shall certify a list of the names and addresses of all delegates elected to the state convention and to the congressional district conventions to the secretary of state on or before March 25, 1922, and that officer will certify a list of all the delegates elected to each congressional district convention to the proper Congressional District Chairman, and he will also certify a list of the delegates elected to the state convention to the state chairman. The convention officers will deliver to each delegate elected to the state or to a congressional district convention a certificate of his election. Persons desiring to file as candidates for delegates to a County Convention must do so on or before February 25, 1922. Blank forms of affidavits for this purpose may be procured from county auditors. Such filing cannot be made until after the apportionment has been made by the county committee, which should be made before February 11, 1922.

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT CONVENTIONS—TIME AND PLACE—Third: the time of holding the several congressional district conventions in all congressional districts containing more than one county, to-wit: the first, second, third, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth and tenth, hereby is fixed for March 30, 1922, at 1:00 P. M., and the time of holding the congressional district conventions in districts composed of not more than one county, to-wit: the fourth and fifth, hereby is fixed for March 18, 1922, at 3:00 P. M., and the places of holding said congressional district conventions are hereby fixed as follows:

Congressional district conventions shall be held for the purpose of endorsing party candidates for member of congress from their respective districts, and also for the purpose of electing or appointing, in such manner as the convention deems best, a congressional district committee to serve until successors are chosen. The names of the candidates endorsed shall be certified by the proper officers of such conventions to the officer with whom such candidates are required to file at the primary election.

DELEGATES TO STATE CONVENTION-APPOR-

DELEGATES TO COUNTY CONVENTION—AP-PORTIONMENT—HOW MADE—Fifth: the duty of apportioning the delegates to the county conventions is by law imposed upon the county committees, and the county committees are hereby directed to make public and to certify to the proper county auditor the apportionment of delegates to said conventions on or before February 11, 1922, using as a basis the vote cast for the party's candidate for governor at the last general election.

APPORTIONMENT OF DELEGATES TO CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT CONVENTIONS IN DISTRICTS CONTAINING ONE COUNTY—Sixth: the duty of apportioning the delegates to which any county is entitled in a congressional district convention in a congressional district not containing more than one county (the fourth and fifth congressional districts) is by law imposed upon the county committee of the county in which such congressional district is situated.

APPORTIONMENT OF DELEGATES TO CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT CONVENTIONS IN DISTRICTS CONTAINING MORE THAN ONE COUNTY—Seventh: the duty of apportioning the delegates to which any county is entitled in a congressional district containing more than one county is by law imposed upon the State Central Committee. Such apportionment is required to be based upon the vote cast for the party candidate for governor at the last preceding general election.

Accordingly, each county or part thereof lying within the first, second, third, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, or tenth congressional district, is hereby allotted one congressional district delegate for each four hundred votes or major fraction thereof cast for the party candidate for governor by such county or part thereof at the last general election, as follows:
