

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PETITION FOR ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF PAYNESVILLE

TO THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PAYNESVILLE, MINNESOTA:

We, the undersigned, being all the owners or lessors upon the premises of the territory described below, hereby request the Council to annex this territory to the City and to extend the city boundaries to include the same, and for that purpose respectfully state:

1. The territory to be annexed consists of approximately ten
(10) to twelve (12) acres and at the present time has no
residents living thereon. That all of these lands lie
entirely within the County of Stearns, State of Minnesota.
That the description of such lands is as follows:

All that part of the Northeast Quarter (NE%) of Section Sixteen (16) and the Northwest Quarter (NW%) of Section Fifteen (15) lying between the Soo Line Railroad right of way and Minnesota Trunk Highway #23 and the East City limits of the City of Paynesville in Stearns County, Minnesota.

- 2. The territory described above abuts upon the City limits at the Northern boundary thereof and none of it is presently included within the corporate limits of any incorporated City. Village or Borrough.
- 3. All of this territory is or is about to become urban or suburban in character, the undersigned intending to put upon said premises industrial development and plat a subdivision as to a part of the remainder into lots for sale. That public utilities are necessary for this development and that there is immediately adjacent to and available to the property water service and that sanitary sewage lines could be made available to the same, and that this Pétition is made in reliance upon the City having indicated that they are willing to

extend the necessary utilities to said property.

DRDINANCE NO. 9-1974

AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX CERTAIN PROPERTY ADDINING THE CITY OF PAYNES-

WHERCAS, certain territory described below is not presently included. within the corporate limits of any incorporated city, village or borrough: and

WHEREAS, this territory borders upon the city limits of the City of Paynesville and is deemed to be urban in character; and

WHEREAS, the property has access to City water and sower and has been developed to some degree and is in a position for further development.

NOW. THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Paynesville ordains:

Section 1. TERRITORY ANNEXED. The corporate limits of the City of Paynesville, Minnesota, are hereby extended to include the unplatted territory described as follows, which territory is now and has heretofore been adjacent to the incorporated limits of the City of Paynesville:

All that part of the Northeast Quarter (NEt) of Section Sixteen (16) and the Northwest Quarter (NUt) of Section Fifteen (15) lying between the Soo Line Railroad right-of-way and Minnesota Trunk Highway #23 and the East City limits of the City of Paynesville in Stearns County, Minnesota.

Section 2. The quantity of land embraced within the foregoing description and bounded as described is approximately ten (10) to twelve (12) acres, more or less.

Section 3. FILING. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file certified copies of this ordinance with the Secretary of State, the County Auditor and the Register of Deeds of the County in which the property is located and the Minnesota Municipal Commission.

Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE OF ANNEXATION. This ordinance takes effect upon passage and publication and the filing of certified copies as directed in Section 3 and approval pursuant to Minnesota Statutes. The City Council does, however, specifically ordein that taxes due and payable during the year 1974 shall be payable by the County Auditor to the Paynesville Town Board.

Upon a vote being taken, all members present voted for the adoption of the ordinance. Persons present and voting 'yea' were Thielen, Jacobson, Hood and Southworth. Absent and not voting was Peteler.
