The Company further agrees that in addition it will pay all postage charges on such shipment of copies.

It is further agreed that if the Company shall fail to accept and pay for such copies of registration and transfer file cards furnished by the State as herein provided, the State may at the discretion of the Secretary of State, rescind and declare such contract null and void and the State shall be considered to be damaged by such failure on

extent of the Company to fulfill this contract to the extent of the difference between the amount that the Company may by that time already have paid to the State and the total that would be paid under the terms of the contract for the complete copy of all the 1934 registration and transfer file cards. It is estimated that the total price of the copies of the 1934 registration and transfer file cards furnished by the State, under the terms of this contract will be approximately Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) and the Company will furnish a bond to the State in that amount, conditioned for the faithful fulfillment of the Company's part of the contract, such bond to be executed and delivered contemporaneously with the execution of this agreement.
