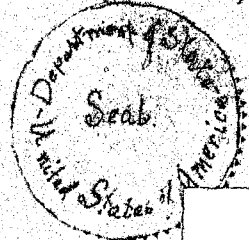


DEPARTMENT OF STATE.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

I CERTIFY That, satisfactory evidence having been exhibited of the appointment of Georg Heinrich Lehmann as Vice Consul of Finland at Duluth, Minnesota. — the President of the United States of America has ordered his recognition as such officer, declaring him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers, and privileges as are allowed to Vice Consuls by the Law of Nations, or by the Laws of the United States.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, Charles Evans Hughes, Secretary of State of the United States of America, has hereunto subscribed my name and caused the Seal of the Department of State to be affixed.



DONE in the District of Columbia this fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and the 146th year of the Independence of the United States of America.

Foreign affairs of the Republic of Finland,

herby make known: that whereas I have found it good and expedient for the maintenance of friendly and commercial relations between Finland and the United States of America appoint a Finnish Vice

therefore I have in virtue of the power granted to me by the Government of Finland, nominated and appointed Mr. Carl Henrik Lahtinen, to the office and during my absence and especially the authorities in his district to grant him their benevolence and confidence and all necessary aid in the exercise of his functions as well as the rights and privileges that pertain to his office and are accorded to the Consuls of other Powers.

Given in Helsinki, November 3, 1900.

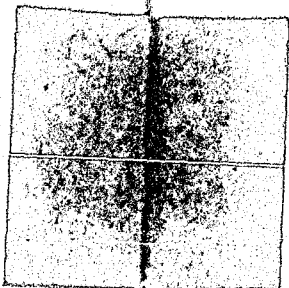
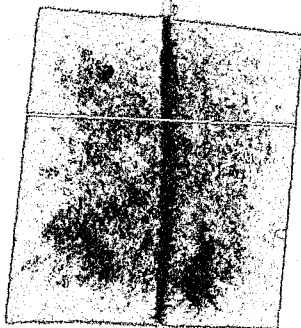
