



Proclamation

AS: our state requires and is entitled to the best quality of social services to guarantee and protect the dignity, health and welfare of all its citizens; and

AS: these services must be administered and maintained by highly skilled and trained professionals in Social Work and other people-related disciplines; and

AS: Social Work professionals accept this challenge by playing a key role in our community, providing solutions to human problems that know no class lines -- family conflicts, health, drugs, aging -- as well as those commonly associated with poverty; and

AS: these professionals need the informed support of each member of our community to continually maintain and improve the quality of social services to individuals and groups;

THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of March, 1975 as

SOCIAL WORK MONTH

Minnesota, and call on each citizen to join the Minnesota Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers in this observance;

HEREBY, I urge each citizen to take responsibility for continued awareness and support of these social service professionals and programs that seek to deal with our complex social ills -- including racism, poverty and crime.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twelfth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-five and of the State, the one hundred and seventeenth.
