- REAS: society depends for its very existence and its continuing well-being on the abilities and performances of individuals; and
- REAS: the effectiveness of individuals, their creativity and self-reliance are intensely affected by teachers; and
- REAS: America must have dedicated and well-prepared professional teachers who will prepare students for a future that will surpass every other age; and
- REAS: teachers of Minnesota and of the nation are thus in a position to affect deeply the public and individual welfare of the country and of each citizen; and
- REAS: for these and many other reasons that occur to everyone, it becomes incumbent upon our citizenry to work not only toward attracting the finest of our youth but also toward retraining the career teachers for the teaching profession;

THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby claim the Month of April 1975 as

TEACHING CAREER MONTH

Minnesota, in order to recognize publicly the importance of teachers and their significance to society and to intensify the public support necessary for them to continue in their tasks.
