



Proclamation

WHEREAS: there are more than 1,300 Americans still in a Missing-In-Action status as a result of the Vietnam Conflict; and
WHEREAS: twenty-eight of these men unaccounted for are from the State of Minnesota; and
WHEREAS: the National League of Families of American Prisoners and Missing in Southeast Asia, along with VIVA, are continually co-sponsoring public awareness campaigns for these men;

THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, March 27, 1975 as

MINNESOTANS STILL CARE DAY

Minnesota, and urge all our citizens to join in their efforts for public awareness of this worthwhile program which formally commences in the State Capitol at Saint Paul, Minnesota, on that date.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capital this twenty-fourth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-five and of the State, the one hundred and seventeenth.
