- REAS: *the students of Minnesota State Colleges represent, in a very real sense, the future of Minnesota; and*
- REAS: *one purpose of education in a democratic society is to produce citizens capable of participating in and contributing to that society, including the governmental process; and*
- REAS: *all citizens have the right, if not the obligation, to be informed on issues of public concern, and to convey their opinions to their duly elected representative; and*
- REAS: *students at Minnesota State Colleges have come to play an increasingly significant role in all phases of the political process in Minnesota;*

THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby claim Thursday, April 3, 1975 as

MINNESOTA STATE COLLEGE STUDENT DAY

Minnesota, and do extend to all students visiting the State Capitol a warm and enthusiastic welcome.
