- AS: the world-renowned United States Navy Band is making a concert appearance in Chatfield, Minnesota on April 29; and
- AS: this spectacular event is to honor the three Arser brothers, born and bred in Chatfield, who have played a combined 61 years with the United States Navy Bands; and
- AS: William and Kenneth, both French horn players, and Samuel, who plays the cornet, fulfill a family tradition as bandmen; and
- AS: their father, Clarence, was Chatfield's high school and city band director, and also directed a military band during World War I; and
- AS: it is significant that the town band, once an important contributor to community life, is perpetuated here in the name and fame of the Chatfield Brass Band; and
- AS: William, Kenneth and Samuel, nurtured in Chatfield's unique environment, have enriched the lives of millions through their fine musicianship as members of the United States Navy Band;

THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby
