WHEREAS: *the Salvation Army in its 95 years of service in the United States has been involved with the physical and spiritual well-being of all people and is dedicated to helping people with dignity, compassion and understanding; and*

WHEREAS: *the Salvation Army realizes that many of society's ills today cannot be cured with just a few words from the "Good Book", but must be dealt with through social action and social services to meet human needs; and*

WHEREAS: *the Salvation Army has always fought a war without guns against hunger, despair and loneliness because of its commitment to all people regardless of race or creed;*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, May 15, 1975 as

MINNESOTA SALVATION ARMY DAY

and urge all citizens of the State of Minnesota to cooperate in helping the Salvation Army continue fighting a good fight against society's problems.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this sixth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-five and of the State, the one hundred and seventeenth.
