PARKING AND TRAFFIC RULES AND REGULATIONS  
NORTHLAND COMMUNITY COLLEGES, THIEF RIVER FALLS, MINNESOTA

Section I - RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Minnesota Community College Board, pursuant to Minnesota Statute 169.966 and Minnesota Session Laws Chapter 966 Section 20 (1971) hereby adopts the following parking Traffic Rules and Regulations to be administered and enforced on the property of Northland Community College.

1. The regulatory provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1961 Chapter 169, as amended, are hereby adopted as traffic regulations controlling the use of parking facilities and private roads, roadways and college property on property owned, leased, occupied or operated by Northland Community College.
2. All persons parking automobiles, snowmobiles or any other vehicle of transportation on property owned, leased, or occupied by Northland Community College will do so at their own risk. No responsibility will be assumed by the college or the state because of loss of property, damage to vehicle while parked, damage which may be incurred through the process of impounding or for any other damage or loss sustained while on the Northland college parking facility.
3. Only those vehicles belonging to students or employees of Northland Community College or authorized college visitors may park on college property.
4. Parking is prohibited on college property in the evening after 12:30 a.m. with the following exceptions:
  - a. Vehicles that are owned or leased by the college.
  - b. Vehicles belonging to those authorized persons who are in attendance at an approved activity which is not completed before 12:00 a.m. When approved activities are not completed until 12:00 a.m., or later, vehicles are to be removed from college property within 30 minutes after the completion of the activity.
  - c. Vehicles belonging to college employees.
5. Parking is prohibited on college roadways, sidewalks, landscaped areas, safety zones, loading zones, within ten feet of intersections, adjacent to yellow curbs, and in areas where parking is expressly prohibited by signs. Exception to this regulation is as follows:
  - a. College-owned vehicles, when being used in the performance of work on college property.
  - b. Vehicles making delivery of goods to the college may park in the loading zones during required delivery time. Flashing signals must be used when making deliveries.
6. Parking lanes are designated by painted white lines. Parking on yellow lane lines or parking in a position which occupies more than one parking lane is prohibited.

7. All vehicles are required to follow directional arrows and signs to gain entrance to and exit from parking area.
8. Maximum speed of vehicles on college property shall be 20 miles per hour.
9. Designated parking for snowmobiles, motorcycles and bicycles are clearly marked. These vehicles must park in the designated area.
10. Nothing in this policy shall prevent state, county, or local law enforcement agencies from enforcing traffic laws in effect in the jurisdictional area in which the college is located. The laws are assumed to be common knowledge and must be obeyed.

Section II - ENFORCEMENT

All authorized law enforcement officers shall see that all rules of this regulation are obeyed and shall arrest and prosecute offenders.

Section III - PENALTIES

1. Any person violating any provision of this regulation shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor. Any fines paid as a result of a violation of this ordinance shall be paid to the city of Thief River Falls in the same manner as fines received from the violation of city of Thief River Falls ordinances.
2. The President, or his designee, Dean of Students or Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds may order any motor vehicle parked at the college in violation of these rules and regulations to be removed. The cost of such removal shall be borne by the owner or operator of the motor vehicle.

Section IV - EFFECTIVE DATE

These rules and regulations shall be in full force and effect from and after their adoption according to law.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC RULES AND REGULATIONS  
ITASCA COMMUNITY COLLEGE, GRAND RAPIDS, MINNESOTA

Section I: Rules and Regulations

The Minnesota Community College Board, pursuant to Minnesota Statute 169.966 and Minnesota Session Laws Chapter 966 Section 20 (1971) hereby adopts the following traffic and parking rules and regulations to be administered and enforced on the property of Itasca Community College.

1. The regulatory provisions of the Minnesota Statutes 1961 Chapter 169, as amended, are hereby adopted as traffic regulations controlling the use of parking facilities and private roads, roadways and college property on property owned, leased, or occupied or operated by Itasca Community College.
2. All vehicles are required to follow directional arrows and signs to gain entrance to and exit from the campus and parking areas. All vehicles are restricted to roads, roadways and parking lots.
3. Designated trail/trails must be used by anyone operating a snowmobile on the college campus. These vehicles are to be driven single file on these trails.
4. Maximum speeds are as posted.
5. All persons parking a vehicle on property owned, leased, or occupied by Itasca Community College will do so at their own risk. No responsibility will be assumed by the college or the state because of loss of property or damage to the vehicle while parked, damage which may be incurred through the process of impounding the vehicle or any other damage or loss sustained while parking on the Community College Campus.
6. Only vehicles belonging to students, employees, or authorized visitors may park on college property.
7. Student and visitor parking is restricted to designated areas.
8. Staff parking is restricted to areas designated, and each staff member must display a parking permit as required by the college.
9. Parking on college property is prohibited after 1:00 a.m. except in the following cases:
  - (a) Vehicles that are owned or leased by the college.
  - (b) Vehicles belonging to those authorized persons who are in attendance at an approved activity which is not completed before 1:00 a.m. When approved activities are not completed until 1:00 a.m., or later, vehicles are to be removed from college property within 30 minutes after the completion of the activity.
  - (c) Vehicles belonging to college employees while on duty.
  - (d) Vehicles belonging to authorized government agents.

10. Parking is prohibited on college roadways, sidewalks, landscaped areas, safety zones, loading zones, within ten feet of intersections, adjacent to yellow curbs and in areas where parking is expressly prohibited by signs. Exceptions to this regulation are as follows:
  - (a) College owned and University of Minnesota vehicles when being used in the performance of work on college property.
  - (b) Vehicles making delivery of goods to the college may park in the delivery area during the required delivery time.
11. Parking lanes are designated by painted white lines. Parking on white lane lines, outside of designated parking areas or parking in a position that occupies more than one parking lane is prohibited.
12. Designated parking for snowmobiles, motorcycles and bicycles is clearly marked. These vehicles must park in designated areas.

Section II: Enforcement

1. All authorized law enforcement officers shall see that all rules of this regulation are obeyed and shall arrest and prosecute offenders.
2. Nothing in this policy shall prevent state, county, or local law enforcement agencies from enforcing traffic laws in effect in the jurisdictional area in which the college is located. The laws are assumed to be common knowledge and must be obeyed.

Section III: Penalties

1. Any person violating any provision of these rules and regulations shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor. Any fines paid as a result of a violation of these rules and regulations shall be paid to the County of Itasca in the same manner as fines received from similar county violations.
2. The College President or his designee may order any motor vehicle parked at the college in violation of these rules and regulations to be removed. The cost of such removal shall be borne by the owner or operator of the motor vehicle.

Section IV: Effective Date

These rules and regulations shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption according to law.

PROPOSED TRAFFIC REGULATIONS FOR ITASCA COMMUNITY COLLEGE CAMPUS

A Public Hearing will be held at 1:00 p.m., February 6, 1975, in Bergh Hall Auditorium on the ICC campus to discuss the following proposed traffic regulations.

Motor vehicles of all types operated on the campus are subject to the regulation established by the Minnesota Community College Board and Itasca Community College and to the regulations established by state, county, and municipal governments with jurisdiction in the area of the college. These regulations have been established: (1) to assure a smooth flow of traffic around and through the campus, (2) to provide and maintain the motor vehicle parking areas for students, faculty, staff, administration and visitors, (3) to protect the pedestrians on campus, (4) to protect property within the campus area, (5) to enable delivery and emergency vehicles to pass freely to campus destinations.

Minnesota Community College Board Policy

Section I: Traffic and Parking Rules and Regulations Adopted

The Minnesota Community College Board, pursuant to Minnesota Statute 169.996 and Minnesota Session Laws Chapter 966 Section 10 (1971) hereby adopts the following traffic and parking rules and regulations to be administered and enforced on the campus of Itasca Community College.

Traffic

- (a) All vehicles entering or leaving the campus via Hwy. No. 169 are required to use the proper one way entry and exit roads.
(b) The designated trail/trails for snowmobiles entering or exiting from the campus are clearly marked. These vehicles are to be driven single file on these trails.
(c) Maximum speeds are as posted.
