



Proclamation

WHEREAS: the International Association of Auditorium Managers (I.A.A.M.) was created at a meeting in Cleveland on December 27, 1924, comprising only six persons; and

WHEREAS: the Association has grown since then to a membership of nearly 700 managers and assistant managers of more than 500 facilities in the United States, Canada, Australia and Germany having a value of billions of dollars of public and private invested funds; and

WHEREAS: these auditoriums, arenas, convention halls, theaters and other types of public assembly facilities have a profound effect on the economic well-being (through the infusion of great amounts of "new money"), the political situation (through nominating conventions and political assemblies), and the culture and life-style (through musical and sports events, theater, entertainment spectaculars and professional and scientific meetings) of all of the communities in which they are situated; and

WHEREAS: the I.A.A.M. is to hold its 50th Annual Conference in Detroit's Cobo Hall and nearby hotels in Detroit and in Windsor, Ontario, July 21, 22, 23 and 24, 1975;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of July 20-26, 1975 as

I.A.A.M. GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to become aware of the great impact and beneficial effect of the activities represented by this organization upon the state of Minnesota and the nation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this sixth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-five and of the State, the one hundred and seventeenth.
