You will please take notice, that the undersigned, will, within 30 days, file an application in the General Land Office, at Washington, D.C., for the survey of that certain unsurveyed Island located in Pelican Lake, St. Louis County, Minnesota, more particularly described as follows:


An unsurveyed Island located in the central portion of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 27, Township 65 North, Range 20 West, 4th P.M. Beginning at N.C. No. 7, on N.E. corner of Lot 2 of said Section; thence south 57° .02' E. a distance of 1751 feet to A.M.C. on N.W. side of island whose witness trees are, viz:

W. Pine 8" N. 65° E-18 ft.; W. Pine 8" S. 32° E-23.4 ft.

Beginning at a point A.M.C. thence S. 18° .05' W. a distance of 215.8 ft., thence S. 21° 43' E. a distance of 289.7 ft., thence No. 48° 34' E. a distance of 128.4 ft., thence N. 6° 26' E. a distance of 227. ft., thence N. 14° 46' E. a distance of 175. ft., thence N. 87° W. a distance of 146.9 ft., thence S. 77° 43' W. a distance of 61.5 ft. to the point of beginning (A.M.C.) containing 1.82 acres.

You are allowed thirty (30) days from the receipt of this notice, within which to file in said General Land Office, any papers you may wish to submit, tending to show cause, if any there be, why the said Island should not be surveyed and disposed of as public land of the United States.
