You will please take notice, that the undersigned, will, within 30 days, file an application in the General Land Office, at Washington, D.C., for the survey of that certain unsurveyed Island located in Pelican Lake, St. Louis County, Minnesota, more particularly described as follows:

An unsurveyed Island located in the central portion of Section 35, Township 65 North, Range 20 West, 4th P.M. Beginning at N.C. No. 15 on Section line between Sections 25 and 36 of said Township, thence South $52^{\circ} 30'$ W. a distance of 3420 feet to A.M.C. on east side of island whose witness trees are, viz:

Base 9" S. 60° E-5 ft.; Base 9" N. 60° W-35 ft.

Beginning at a point A.M.C. thence N. $11^{\circ} 20'$ E. a distance of 81.0 ft., thence N. $52^{\circ} 55'$ W. a distance of 61.6 ft., thence S. $41^{\circ} 28'$ W. a distance of 121.8 ft., thence S. $7^{\circ} 58'$ E. a distance of 97.4 ft., thence N. $88^{\circ} 31'$ E. a distance of 75.8 ft., thence N. $19^{\circ} 40'$ E. a distance of 72.6 ft. to point of beginning (A.M.C.) containing 0.47 acre.

You are allowed thirty (30) days from the receipt of this notice, within which to file in said General Land Office, any papers you may wish to submit, tending to show cause, if any there be, why the said Island should not be surveyed and disposed of as public land of the United States.
