The preservation of American ideals is essential to the continued progress of our Republic, a progress which in the past has been amazing alike in industrial, educational and spiritual growth. A study of these ideals and a reflection upon the privileges and obligations of citizenship is most appropriate as we approach the annual celebration of Independence Day.

NOW THEREFORE, I, J. A. O. Preus, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim and designate Sunday, July 2, as


AMERICA FIRST DAY.

I wish to urge all citizens not only to display the flag upon that day, but to discuss and consider our American Ideals of Equality of Opportunity, Universal Education, Religious Liberty, Majority Rule, Adequate Reward for Labor, Respect for the Home, Abolition of Class and Caste, Respect for Property Rights, Freedom of Speech and Press, Regard for Childhood, Old Age and Womanhood.

Since the welfare of church and state are so closely interdependent, I wish also to urge that the day be observed in the churches and Sunday schools, with the singing of patriotic hymns and the discussion of these American ideals.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed hereto this twenty-first day of June, 1922.
