WHEREAS: Hazel O'Rourke has enchanted children in the classroom for fifty years with her spirit, charm, and wit, all symbolic of her Irish heritage; and

WHEREAS: the children she has taught, their parents, and acquaintances have always enjoyed a perpetual love affair with Hazel O'Rourke; and

WHEREAS: the community at Easton takes pride in Hazel O'Rourke as an esteemed citizen and a talented teacher; and

WHEREAS: Hazel O'Rourke's contributions to the people she has served are legendary; and

WHEREAS: those legends include match-making, service to her church, counselor to new and experienced teachers, and care for the ill of body and spirit; and
