



Proclamation

WHEREAS: the United States Coast Guard is a unique service dedicated to the protection of life and property and the elimination of hazards thereto, to the preservation of the environment and marine fisheries, and to the enforcement of Federal laws and security of our ports, waterways and Nation; and

WHEREAS: the men and women of the United States Coast Guard work selflessly and untiringly to help, protect, educate and serve the people of the United States and others, regardless of nationality, who sail our lakes, rivers and oceans; and

WHEREAS: the United States Coast Guard will celebrate its 185th anniversary on August 4, 1975;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim August 4, 1975 as

COAST GUARD DAY

in Minnesota, and urge all our citizens to take recognition of the 185th anniversary of the United States Coast Guard.
