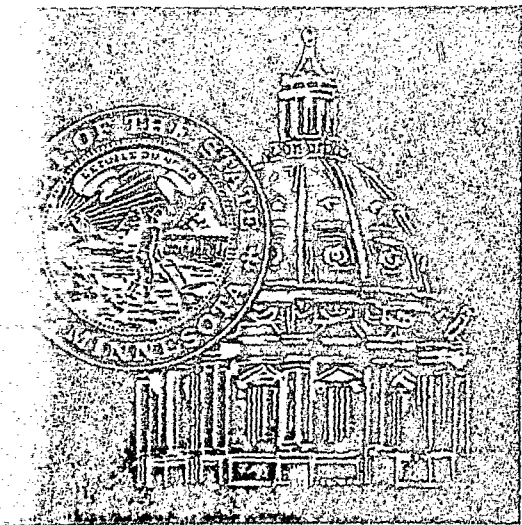




State of Minnesota
