PROCLAMATION.


WHEREAS, the shop craft employes of the railroads have seen fit to discontinue work rather than abide by the recent decision of the United States Railroad Labor Board, and

WHEREAS, the employment of other men who will accept the terms of the decision has been necessary for the operation of the railroads and the carrying of the United States mails, and


WHEREAS, His Excellency, the President of the United States, has issued a proclamation directing all persons to refrain from all interference with the lawful efforts to maintain interstate transportation and the carrying of the United States mails, and inviting the cooperation of all public authorities and the aid of all good citizens to uphold the laws and to preserve the public peace, and to facilitate those operations in safety which are essential to life and liberty, and the security of property and our common welfare.

NOW THEREFORE, I, J. A. O. Preus, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby invite the attention of the citizens of Minnesota, to this proclamation by the President and I do hereby urge all peace officers and all county and municipal officials to aid in the preservation of law and order and to take steps to prevent any unlawful acts which will interfere with the carrying of the mails and the transportation of goods and persons which is so essential to the welfare of all the people of the state.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed hereto this 13th day of July, 1922.
