



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Minneapolis Bicentennial Hall, an exhibition sponsored by Minneapolis '76, the city's Bicentennial Commission, will portray the past, present, and future of Minneapolis; and

WHEREAS: Minneapolis Bicentennial Hall, located on the 51st floor of the IDS Tower, will contain dioramas portraying historical Minneapolis "firsts" in a salute to the state's colorful pioneers; and

WHEREAS: the exhibition will be one of the most ambitious and comprehensive Bicentennial efforts in the state, and one of the largest in the nation; and

WHEREAS: Minneapolis Bicentennial Hall will provide the opportunity for more than one million visitors to carry away the spirit of our history and the excitement of our future; and

WHEREAS: the exhibition will serve as a great civic focal point for the Bicentennial year and long thereafter;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, August 11, 1974 as

MINNEAPOLIS BICENTENNIAL HALL HERITAGE DAY

in Minnesota.
