there are more hungry people in the world today than ever before, who are denied RIMINEAS:

the right to liberty because they do not have freedom from hunger; and

current food scarcity, famine, and the grawing gap between rich and poor nations have denied the very poor their right to the pursuit of happiness; and WHEREAS:

we stand ready to commit ourselves, both as concerned individuals and as a nation, WHEREAS: to increase food aid to developing countries as well as assistance for long-range

improvement of agriculture in those countries; and we call upon our government to redouble its efforts to eliminate hunger here at home;

HCW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of September 21 - 28, 1975 as

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to support voluntary agencies working to eliminate sunger, and to evaluate their own consumption patterns.

FURTHERMORE: as our nation celebrates its 200th birthday, we should recall the affirmation in our Declaration of Independence that "all men are created equal...(with the) right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness."
