

Troclamation

TEREAS: two hundred years ago, the men and women of the American Revolution pledged their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor in the struggle for independence, which ended September 3, 1783, with the signing of the Treaty of Paris. In breaking with the past, they did not neglect to build a better system for their posterity; and

TEREAS: today, we look back 200 years, not merely to take pride in our history; we look back during this Bicentennial to learn some practical lessons for today and tomorrow. As we pay tribute, let us renew together our Founding Fathers' pledge to our country -- our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred honor. Let us always remember that freedom does not come free; and

EREAS: Congress, by a joint resolution of February 29, 1952, designated the 17th day of September of each year as Citizenship Day in commemoration of the formation and signing of the Constitution of the United States on September 17, 1787; and

EREAS: by a joint resolution of August 2, 1956, Congress authorized the President to designate the period beginning September 17 and ending September 23 of each year as Constitution Week;

W, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim ptember 17, 1975 as

... CITIZENSHIP DAY

Minnesota, and urge all Federal, State and local officials, as well as leaders of civic, ucational and religious organizations, to conduct appropriate ceremonies and programs on lat day.

IRTHERMORE, I also proclaim the period beginning September 17 and ending September 23, 1975

i Minnesota, and urge all citizens to observe that week with appropriate ceremonies and ctivities in their schools, churches and in other suitable places in order to foster a etter understanding of the Constitution, and of the rights and responsibilities of all pericans.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this seventeenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-five and of the State the one hundred seventeenth.
