WHEREAS: the influence of the data processing industry is being felt more keenly yearly in the lives of each individual in our society; and

WHEREAS: the State of Minnesota ranks high in the manufacture of computers and associated peripheral hardware as well as in the writing of programs, especially application programs and operating systems, to accomplish a countless variety of tasks which benefit or affect us all; and

WHEREAS: the Association of Computing Machinery has selected the Twin Cities for its annual conference, bringing together many of the leading and influential people in computer science and programming; and

WHEREAS: the annual conference will present a look at the past, present and future developments in data processing which will examine the impact of the computer on the quality of all of our lives;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 19, 1975 as

COMPUTER WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to recognize the contributions made by computer manufacturers and programmers toward all facets of the nation's progress and well-being, and the potential value of this work for our country's future.
