

An Ordinance changing the name of the Village of South Stillwater to that of the Village of Bayport.

WHEREAS, There was heretofore presented to the Village Council of the Village of South Stillwater, a municipal corporation duly incorporated under the laws of the State of Minnesota, a petition signed by 197 of the legal voters of said village, being more than twenty per cent of the legal voters of said village, requesting that the name of said village be changed, and

WHEREAS, Such proceedings were duly had and taken relating to said petition for a change of the name of said village that it was heretofore duly determined by the Village Council of the Village of South Stillwater that such new name of said village should be the Village of Bayport; and a special election of the legal voters of said Village of South Stillwater was duly called to be held and was held in said village on Tuesday, the 26th day of September, 1922, to vote upon the question of changing the name of said village to that of the Village of Bayport, and

WHEREAS, At said special election there were cast altogether by the legal voters of said village 188 votes, 151 votes being in favor of the change of the name of said village to that of the Village of Bayport, and 37 votes being against such change of name, and

WHEREAS, Said votes at said special election having been duly canvassed by the Village Council of the Village of South Stillwater and it appearing that a majority of all of the votes cast upon the question of changing the name of the village were in favor of such change of name of such village to that of the Village of Bayport, Now, Therefore,

THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF SOUTH STILLWATER DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the name of the Village of South Stillwater be and the same is hereby changed so that such name is and hereafter shall be the Village of Bayport.

That during all the times of said publications and for more than one year immediately preceding the said date of first publication of the aforesaid matter said newspaper was printed from and in the place from which during all of said times it purported to be issued, to-wit: the printing office and place of business of said Stillwater Trade News in the City of Stillwater in the County of Washington and State of Minnesota, in the English language, and in column and sheet form equivalent in space to at least to four pages, with five columns to the page, each seventeen and three-quarters inches long.

That during all the times aforesaid said newspaper was a weekly newspaper, and was issued once in each week from a known office, to-wit: the office of said Stillwater Trade News, established and kept in said City of Stillwater, and equipped with skilled workmen and the necessary material for preparing and printing the same; and that during all the times aforesaid part of the press work of said newspaper at each issue thereof was done in its said known office of publication.


