2. COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES. As compensation for satisfactory performance of the duties herein described, the Special Attorneys shall be compensated at a rate not to exceed \$50.00 per hour for a total not to exceed \$5,000. The Special Attorneys shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the State of Minnesota, Commissioner of Administration governing the travel of state officers and employees. All compensation and expenses shall be paid from funds appropriated to the Department of Revenue.

STATUS. The Special Attorneys shall not be considered state employees, shall not be eligible for the state's life insurance or basic health benefits coverage and shall not accrue vacation or sick leave or any benefits other than those expressly provided herein.

Dear Mr. Spannaus:

You will recall that the constitutionality of the so-called Fiscal Disparities Law, Minn. St. Ch. 473F, was attacked and sustained in the case of <u>Village of Burnsville</u> <u>v. Onischuk</u>, 222 N.W.2d 523 (1974).

I am sure that you are also aware that new suits have recently been brought again challenging the constitutionality of the Fiscal Disparities Law (three in Scott County and two in Anoka County).

In the earlier case, Mr. John W. Windhorst, Jr., acting as attorney for the Metropolitan Council, was the principal lawyer for the defense. I understand that while attorneys on your staff in the Solicitor General's office will assume the main burden of the defense in the present cases, you also feel it advicable to have the assistance of Mr. Windhorst available as a consultant, in view of the special knowledge and experience he gained in the previous litigation.

I concur with your view on this point, and on behalf of the Department of Revenue, I recuest you to contract with Mr. Windhorst to act as a consultant to the Attorney General's office in the pending litigation. The Department of Revenue will contribute up to \$5,000 for the payment of legal fees to Mr. Windhorst for such consultant services.

I understand that the Metropolitan Council has also agreed to contribute \$1,000 for the payment of Mr. Windhorst's services in the pending litigation. Hon. Warren Spannaus - Page Two
