# Proclamation

WHEREAS: the women's conference of the National Safety Council represents some 40 members at large and 59 national and international women's organizations with an outreach to 50 million women; and

WHEREAS: the Women's Conference has recognized the need for, and initiated, a National Crusade to have Safety on the Streets (S.O.S.); and

WHEREAS: the Safety on the Streets Crusade represents an action-oriented program for volunteers nationwide who marshal the human resources of their communities and public service, civic, fraternal, and law enforcement agencies to have safe neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS: program aspects of S. O. S. include automobile, bicycle, pedestrian, personal, and school safety, with public support being urged for alcohol and drug counter-measures and national highway safety standards;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 26 through November 1, 1975 as

in Minnesota, in recognition of the outstanding contribution to communities throughout the nation of volunteer womanpower, united to have Safety on the Streets.
