



Proclamation

EAS: public concern about public education should be not only year-round but should also reach far beyond the local community; and

EAS: the benefits to the local community in greater tax yield from higher-income residents; lure of business and industry; reduced welfare, unemployment, and law enforcement costs are well understood - but we might not realize fully we also have a stake in the quality of education in states and neighborhoods outside our own; and

EAS: in an increasingly mobile society, few settle in the community where they attended school, dispersing throughout the land, thus possibly resulting in inferior school systems far away; and

EAS: aside from human considerations, the nation's schools - not just one's community's schools - are everyone's responsibility; and

EAS: high population mobility and the greater resources of the federal government argue strongly for increased federal support of education and concerned citizens are looking for ways to carry that message more forcefully to our representatives in Washington;

THEREFORE, I, ~~Wendell R. Anderson~~, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the theme "Our Future Is In Our Schools" - November 16 - 22, 1975 as

AMERICAN EDUCATION WEEK

Minnesota, and do encourage local citizen support and active participation in the improvement of education, with a stress on learning more about schools as a basis for active and continued parental involvement.
